

<p><b>Explain the project in one sentence</b></p>	<p>To design and co-produce a new service model in MSK in which patient measured outcomes and lifestyle treatments are a key focus.</p>
<p><b>Tell us about the project and sponsor in no more than 175 words</b></p>	<p>There are many voluntary, charitable, and local council resources available in the Community to improve the health and well being of the local population. Identifying, signposting and co-ordinating the use of these resources is likely to both reduce intervention rates and demand for primary care appointments. Improving access to these resources will improve the general health of those accessing the system as well as improving the post-operative outcomes for those who require surgical intervention.</p> <p>Our sponsor is the Programme Director for Planned Care for Surrey Heartlands Health and Social Care Partnership and CCG's and is involved in pathway redesign for the musculoskeletal network. Our aim is to reduce demand for Joint replacement and secondary intervention in MSK by self-referral for co-ordinated, focused and well evidenced intervention at an early stage. The challenge of this project is to solve why the current models of MSK are focused on surgical solutions and not lifestyle and movement models and craft solutions for long term sustainable models of health without surgical intervention.</p>
<p><b>What skills or attributes are you looking for in a fellow?</b></p>	<p>An ability to work across and with a large number of organisations to coordinate access to existing resource as well as identifying possible new resources.</p> <p>A level of innovation and passion will be required to challenge the paradigm and use new models of care that are citizen led and part of new lifestyle models of care. The Fellow will be supported through Executive Coaching models, a strong culture of learning and models of population based healthcare which will scope options for local based models of care.</p>
