<p>Tell us about the project and sponsor in no more than 175 words</p>	<p>Evidence tells us that when children experience four or more “adverse childhood experiences” (ACE’s) and are exposed to multiple traumas, this increases the risk of mental health, risky sexual behaviour, violence, homelessness, diabetes, heart disease, obesity, drug and alcohol dependence and many other implications.</p> <p>Many services are opting to train their staff in trauma informed practice and have seen positive results. What’s missing is a system wide approach which ensure consistency, targeted workforce development where there is the most need and where it can have the most impact, and services collaborating and working together to have the best outcomes for people.</p> <p>This project will begin by building a picture of practice in both Kent and Medway STP and other parts of the country, building</p>
