

<p>Explain the project in one sentence</p>	<p>An EU project (http://www.interreg2seas.eu/en/CASCADE) developing a model of care for people living with dementia (PLWD) and implementing the design, construction and operation of a Dementia Village in Dover.</p>
<p>Tell us about the project and sponsor in no more than 175 words</p>	<p>I am a Consultant Geriatrician with a passion for innovation and change. I have experience of clinical leadership and quality improvement, with Trust and HSJ awards for service development.</p> <p>The Dementia Village is part of an exciting EU project involving partners in England, Holland, Belgium and France. The partners include centres of excellence for dementia care and three Universities. Our collaborative partner, The England Centre for Practice Development will support our Fellow.</p> <p>The Fellow will co-design a new model of care for PLWD as well as supporting design, construction and operational plans for a Dementia Village in Dover, based on existing housing stock. Innovative use of technology will aim to enable residents whilst exploring opportunities to improve safety and predict health change.</p> <p>Integration with other providers is at the heart of our project and the outcomes will help to directly steer European social policy.</p> <p>EKHUFT's proximity to Europe makes it an ideal NHS organisation to learn and benefit from the different approaches to older people's care in Europe.</p>
<p>What skills are you looking for in a fellow?</p>	<p>We are looking for someone who will be excited and motivated by the opportunity to interact with and learn from organisations outside of the NHS and who is willing to play a key role in a project that aims to change health and care for older people across Europe.</p> <p>The fellow will need to be capable of working independently and able to make decisions, but will also need to work well in a team environment. This will include working with people from different cultures and with backgrounds in different healthcare systems.</p>

The innovative nature of the project means that the ability to think “outside the box” will be valuable. The project also has specific objectives and timelines so the ability to plan and work to deadlines will be equally valuable.

Because of the variety of project partners and stakeholders good communication skills will be important.

The Fellow will be supported by colleagues and project partners in the development of their skills and capabilities.
