<p><b>Tell us about the project and sponsor in no more than 175 words</b></p>	<p>In summer 2017 Clever Together and HEE ran #LetsWorkTogether: an online workshop with staff from across the KSS region on the subject of retention. Over 1250 people joined the conversation and since then we have been analysing the huge amount of data generated. #LetsWorkTogether, is due for publication in Dec 17 in the midst of a national focus on retention – we feel the work will change the conversation around retention.</p> <p>We therefore want a Fellow to join us to a) take our #LetsWorkTogether findings on the road and to have conversations across the patch to raise awareness and generate ways to turn the research into actions b) to find out what is working and why across the patch and c) to get involved in supporting and testing out initiatives with partners on the back of this.</p> <p>This project has support from Dr Pete Thomond (Managing Director of Clever Together) and James Freed (Chief Information Officer at HEE) both of whom you will have a mentoring link with and who have excellent networks on a national stage.</p>
