<p>Tell us about the project and sponsor in no more than 175 words</p>	<p>The project will use a range of methodologies to understand more fully a) motivation for the suicide, b) discover signs and signals c) uncover opportunities for intervention d) address systemic blocks to progressing interventions</p> <p>The Darzi Fellow will exploit strong links that we have with Primary Care Mental Health Social Workers, Kent Coroners and crisis care providers and European research networks. The project will use human centred design to understand the lives, behaviour and motivations of individuals in the months before their death, using support from Christ Church Canterbury University and using multiple research methods e.g ethnography, grounded theory and quantitative analysis, the project will work with families and friends of people who have died by and attempted suicide to learn how a system can support individuals better and prevent harm.</p> <p>Jess Mookherjee has supported research and innovation in mental health and wellbeing since 2007. She has a national track record leading public mental health and substance misuse programmes and is a trained mentor and coach. She is the Public Health Training Programme Director for Kent and Medway.</p>
